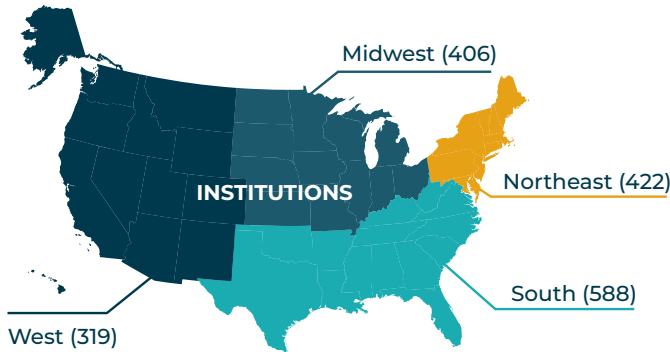

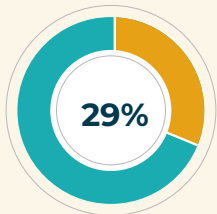

INSTITUTIONAL REPRESENTATION AND RECOGNIZED ACCREDITORS

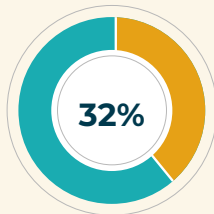

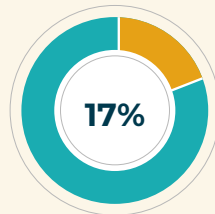
MEMBERS INSTITUTIONS BY DEGREE TYPE



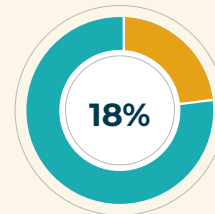

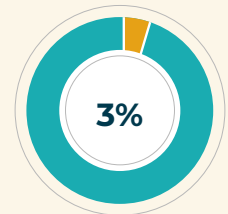
