


### Higher education under siege?

Skills crisis

- Financial crisis: decreased public funding and the 1 trillion dollar student loan debt
- QA crisis: Accreditation failing to promote quality and relevance (US Senate)


#### What is happening

- Increased scrutiny
  - University closings (Albania, Romania, Kenya, Nigeria, Philippines)
  - Naming and shaming (S. Korea)
  - Tightening of rules and controls (Hungary, Netherlands, Poland, Russia, Yemen)
- Consolidation of QA structures / processes
  - From program accreditation to institutional accreditation (Colombia)
  - Compulsory accreditation (Saudi Arabia)
  - Decentralized accreditation (Mexico)
  - Merger of QA structures (Austria, Ireland, Malaysia)

#### What is happening (II)

- Reliance on funding mechanisms for QA purposes
  - Funding formula (Netherlands)
  - Performance funding in the US
  - Performance contracts (Austria, Chile, France)
- Deregulation (Australia & England)
